# COVID-19 UPDATE

Don Guckert, as a member of the CIMT, provided an update on actions across campus with regard to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### MASTER PLANNING

**FACULTY SENATE / STAFF COUNCIL** – Regular semi-annual meetings with the Faculty Senate, Staff Council have been scheduled or held, as well as ad hoc meetings with the UISG and GSS groups to better engage university students in the process of Campus Master Planning.

**THEME UPDATES** – The overall Master Planning progress chart depicting the components of each theme and progress to date was shared. Each theme will be brought back for review and input, the next being the site section.

**WAYFINDING UPDATE** – The vehicular portion of this theme is approximately 75-80% done, leaving signage and messaging in preparation of deployment. This will then progress to the bikeway plan.

**ART DISPLAY PROGRESS** – The goals and objectives for this theme have been drafted, providing structure to integrate and promote art across campus. Specific location across campus are being evaluated now.

**CAMPUS ENCHANCEMENT PROGRAM UPDATE** – This program that is funded from a fee of 0.5% of all capital project's construction budget, is to be used to help advance projects to improve the "outside" of campus, such as art, landscape, signage, etc. At this moment, we are moving forward with a sign project that would gradually replace old signage with new signage consistent with the campus signage standards. The campus has been setup with priority levels to help analyze the need. It is anticipated that 10-12 will be completed this season.

### LONG RANGE PLANS

**WELL-BEING CENTER** – With the inevitable demolition of West Lawn, options for a new Well-Being Center are being evaluated. Options include replacing the facility in kind or adding to and enhancing the program. What would enhancement mean, concerns with increased student fees, relocation opportunities and alternative funding schemes are all part of this evaluation.

## SPACE MANAGEMENT

**IRA STORAGE** – The Independence Road Annex, which currently houses inventory for the Library, Theater and Book Store will now also be housing Museum inventory.

**VETERANS RELOCATION** – IVETS is being relocated to the second floor of Calvin Hall as a temporary (3-5 years) solution, while long term-term options are being considered.

**SDS RELOCATION** – Student Disability Services is being relocated to the first floor of the University Capitol Centre, as a short-term solution. Concerns about privacy and confidentiality were discussed, as well as the importance of branding moving forward in a more prominent location.

#### MISCELLANEOUS PLANNING ISSUES

**OXBOWS** – A proposal for restoration of an Oxbow along the Clear Creek will be brought to an upcoming meeting for consideration.

**PARKING** – A team has been assembled by Parking and Transportation to advance programmatic needs for Parking. More to come on this.

**JEFFERSON BUILDING** – The Jefferson Building will stay in the UI inventory and renovation plans are to create a campus services support building with a series of open floor plates allowing flexibility depending on the need.
