INTRODUCTIONS AND NEW MEMBER WELCOME

With the start of the Fall Semester, our new and returning committee members made a round of introductions. The charter and planning process were summarized for reference.

PROGRESS REPORT ON PLANNING INITIATIVES

- Facilities Plans
The Colleges' facilities plans are progressing. A summary of the process was provided for reference.
- South of Burlington Land Use
The conceptual land use plan presented to accommodate a second year live on campus plan is now being reevaluated for an alternate use.
- Capital Planning
The capital plan, which works with projects within a 10-year window, is refining the project by breaking it into three parts: Building Improvement Plans (BIP), Site Improvement Plans (SIP) and Utilities Improvement Plans (UIP).
- Enhancement Fund
The Enhancement Fund will help fund projects specific to site improvement, such as the Building Monument Sign project and the Campus Gateway project, including the partnership with the City of Iowa City at the Dubuque Street entrance to the city.

An accessibility layer to be referenced when doing any site improvements was raised as important to be considered.

- Future of Work
With 1,400 people applying for a version of remote/hybrid on campus, evaluating space needs during this pilot phase continues.
- West Campus Service Center
The relocation of the West Campus Service Center to the Hawkeye Campus is being evaluated.
- Women's Gymnastics
A Women's Gymnastics training facility is being evaluated for placement on the Hawkeye Campus, providing space for the Spirit Squad and training space for Gymnastics, Field Hockey and Soccer.
- Band Practice Field
Neighborhood meetings have been taking place, while proposals for development options are being requested.
