UIHC WATER TOWER UPDATE

The location of the UIHC Water Tower has been adjusted to enable progress of the UIHC Master Plan. The new location, north of the Practice Field and Lot 75, will accommodate a wider structure than initially studied, providing increased pressure to support campus expansion. The height of the structure will need to be equal to that of today's water tower.

Discussion included the design and material being considered.

As the plan develops, it will be brought back for input on design.

WEST CAMPUS PARKING STRUCTURE

The committee was updated on the revised site orientation of the proposed parking structure in Lot 43. The structure will be situated in a more north/south direction improving loading and unloading, pedestrian safety and vehicular site access, especially during events in this area.

CAPITAL PLANNING PROCESS

The Campus Development Plan approach is being re-envisioned with academic units being more engaged and influencing campus master planning efforts. Colleges will develop their strategic plans and aspirations that will then in turn define facility's needs. This is to be done annually using a defined timeline of analysis, setting university priorities, and then developing the annual "capital" plan.

SPACE POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

Space Guidelines and Principles are being developed for use in planning new and major renovations. This document will provide goals, objectives, principles, and expectations for space use.

New Academic Building, west side of campus.

Programming is underway for this proposed building, which will determine space requirements. This will be followed by programming it into the space of the facility.

ART BUILDING UPDATE

Phase one, consisting of updates to the shell and infrastructure of the building is underway. Space programming for the Graduate College, Planning & Public Affairs, and Art Education is being refined.

SITE IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Site Improvement Plan is now in the phase of building metrics and tools to help in determine needs and prioritization of planned projects.

DESTINATION IOWA GRANT

There has been discussion about this grant – we are not eligible but will be engaged with the City of Iowa City and Coralville on their requests.
