## WEST CAMPUS PARKING RAMP (HAWKEYE RAMP)

The West Campus Parking Ramp project design features were shared. Their main goal in the design of this facility is to maintain a safe and inviting parking area for users with as much transparency as possible.

The exterior will have metal mesh and a lot of translucent glass. Brick accents at the stair towers and the north and south sides that references Kinnick Stadium, metal paneling in large rectangular elements that reference the West Campus Transportation Center. An art interest above the main entrance canopy called kinetic material that is a series of small metal pieces that move with the wind. The main entry with canopy is easily identifiable and accessible. There will be LED lighting throughout with illumination at night. Placement of the Tigerhawk is strategic and connects the area with Athletics.

Discussion included walkway connections, the potential for multicolor lighting using the LED lights, technology that will help drivers with open spaces in the facility, and options for expansion.

#### CAMBUS MAINTENANCE FACILITY

The proposal for expansion of the Cambus Maintenance Facility was presented. With the decision by Parking and Transportation to move forward with electric buses, expansion of the Cambus facility will be required. The addition would be about 3,900 square feet and attached to the north side of the current facility. This section would be a bit taller to accommodate the maintenance of the electric buses.

Discussion included the ramifications to Fleet Services and consideration of flooding in design.

As this design progresses it will be brought back for further review.

#### MASTER PLAN UPDATE - EAST CAMPUS

Aspects of the Master Plan where shared showing conceptual facilities across the East Campus. Specific items discussed included:

Continued design of the <u>Dubuque Street Gateway</u>, located adjacent to the Mayflower Residence Hall as you enter Iowa City. This project is being shared with the City of Iowa City.

Studies being conducted on the use of the <u>Band Practice Field</u> as a residential community connected to the University of Iowa.

Various spaces at the <u>Arts Campus</u> identified are being held that when developed will be tied to the arts.

Expansion of the <u>College of Public Health</u> to accommodate and consolidate programs that are currently elsewhere across campus.

Develop a connection of the East and Arts Campuses via the <u>T. Anne Cleary Walkway</u>.

Creation of additional research space at the <u>lowa Advanced Technology Laboratories</u> (IATL).

Programming of space to the east of the <u>Pappajohn Business Building</u> in associated with the Tippie College of Business.

Expansion of the Campus Recreation and Wellness Center to the South.

Studies of an additional <u>pedestrian walkway</u> across the river to the West Campus.

It is planned that <u>Future Academic Growth</u> will be concentrated in the main campus.

### CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The FY 2023 Campus Development Plan was summarized for new members and specific project were highlighted, including:

Pentacrest Modernizations on the <u>Pentacrest</u> that include MacLean Hall, Jessup Hall, and Macbride Hall. The enabling force behind Pentacrest project would be the <u>Art Building</u> Revitalization project for the Graduate College, which is underway and then the renovation of <u>Gilmore Hall</u> as an Administrative Center for Campus.

Modernization of the Main Library and the IMU would concentrate on building systems.

Relocation of the <u>Cultural Centers</u> to a section of Hubbard Park.

Miscellaneous Improvements to Calvin Hall for Distance Learning.

Purchase of the remaining <u>UCC</u> space is being considered.

The consideration was offered about having a conference center on campus.
