Welcome and Introductions

Our new chair, Scott Spak, provided insight into our committee's mission, offering lenses into role, organization, geography; and how we advise and what success from this committee looks like. The year ahead will bring building review, learning and development and long-term and big picture plans beginning with the Iowa River Corridor project.

This was followed with a quick round of introductions.

Hawkeye Recreation Service Building – Construct Facility

This project was brought to CPC previously to review the changes and updated façade of the current building. It was found that the existing space with the additional requests will lead to constructing an entirely new building. This new 2,000 sf building will be built at the same location as the existing building. The new building will include more space to accommodate program support for the new challenges course, including irrigation, increased electrical needs, the addition of single user restrooms, and a covered area for shade.

The facade will be a combination of concrete block and fiber/cement siding.

Discussion included the recommendations of water bottle fillers, charging stations, bike lockup stations, and an expanded apron at the entrance to help control debris caused by equipment movement, and specifics about the secured seating around the parameters of the open covered area.

The committee supported the project design asking the design project manager to take the few committee recommendations back to the design team for consideration.

River Corridor Planning

With new committee members, Joe walked through the master planning approach.

We ran out of time at this meeting and will continue this discussion at the next meeting.

Scott discussed the committee doing a potential site visit or two to various areas on campus. No specific action was taken.
