IATL - Building Renovation and Addition

Conceptual designs for the renovation and addition to the lowa Advanced Technology Lab (IATL) were presented. Keeping with the architect's design intent and using the existing foundation, a 4-story addition on the west side of the building is being designed, as well as renovation to the first floor taking advantage of space not currently used well. The first level will be student centric with a new exterior patio to connect section and amenities. A secondary entrance facing the riverwalk will be added. More glazing at the ground level will bring better views in and out of the building. The Sol LeWit will be shifted slightly north to accommodate the addition.

Discussion included security and circulation from entrances through the building; providing appropriate numbers of public spaces and bathrooms to accommodate the additional occupants and visitors to the building; additional office stations to accommodate the increased number of graduate students; new classrooms including general assignment classrooms; and opportunities to visually communicated the sense of the entrances to the building.

Committee members provided feedback to the design team for consideration.

Site Improvement Plan

A DRAFT summary of the 2025 Site Improvement Plan (SIP) was provided. This will be revised throughout the spring to supplement the Building Improvement Plan (BIP). The SIP is also being reviewed with campus leadership, the Master Planning Team, and Campus Development Team. Both the SIP and BIP are updated every spring with adjustments made to integrate program needs of the Colleges.

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Discussions included incorporating ideas of users of the space, how CPC members can help with advocacy and endorsement of these projects and the challenges with funding site improvements.

Members are encouraged to bring feedback and act as an advocate for projects in their particular spaces.
